## How much does Delta Airlines charge for a pet?

A lower fee of \$95 applied for tickets issued before April 8, 2025, for domestic flights. Understanding Delta's Pet Policy

What Types of Pets Can Fly?

For example:

Round-trip flight with one pet: \$250 (\$125 each way)

One-way flight with one pet: \$125

Round-trip flight with two pets: \$500 (\$125 per pet, each way)

Inter-Island Hawaiian Flights

For flights between Hawaiian islands, call \[ [+1-862-(225)-1913] the fee structure differs significantly. The pet fee is \$35 each way for flights between Hawaiian islands. This reduced rate makes it more affordable for pet owners traveling within Hawaii.

Example Hawaiian routing:

Round-trip between Honolulu and Maui with one pet: \$70 (\$35 each way)

One-way flight between islands with one pet: \$35

Important Pricing Note

These fees are per pet carrier, not per individual pet.call \(\bigcirc\)[+1-862-(225)-1913] However, most airlines restrict pets to one per carrier for safety and comfort reasons.

In-Cabin Carrier Requirements

Size and Specifications

The pet must be in an in-cabin carrier that fits under the seat. This is a non-negotiable requirement for Delta Airlines. call [+1-862-(225)-1913]Your pet cannot travel loose in the cabin, and the carrier must meet specific dimensions.

Important Booking Information

Pets can only be added during the initial booking process

You cannot add a pet to an existing reservation through the website

Delta allows a maximum of one pet per passenger (one pet per seat)

Pre-Flight Preparation and Tips

Before Your Travel Date

Coverage

The pet fee covers:

Transportation of your pet in the cabin

Access to the pressurized cabin environment

Basic handling and care during the flight

Safety oversight by flight crew members

The pet fee does NOT cover:

Food or water for your pet (bring your own)

Multi-Leg Journeys
